## Bigfoot

Bigfoot, also known as Sasquatch is the name given to a cryptid ape-or hominid-like creature that some people believe inhabits forests in North America. Bigfoot is usually described as a large, hairy, bipedal humanoid.

Bigfoot is described in reports as a large hairy ape-like creature, in a range of 6.6-9.8 ft tall, weighing in excess of 500 pounds, and covered in dark brown or dark reddish hair. Purported witnesses have described large eyes, a pronounced brow ridge, and a large, low-set forehead; the top of the head has been described as rounded and crested, similar to the sagittal crest of the male gorilla. Bigfoot is commonly reported to have a strong, unpleasant smell by those who claim to have encountered it. The enormous footprints for which it is named have been as large as 24 inches long and 8 inches wide. While most casts have five toes — like all known apes — some casts of alleged Bigfoot tracks have had numbers ranging from two to six.



This picture was captured here at Triple Creek by our resident photographer Charles. The image of a human can clearly be distinguished. Is this a human soul?




### *Winnaway Bed & Breakfast*
