



Nature Trail

Years ago, there was once a nature trail behind the jam shack that made for a very interesting short walk, and yet provided information on local trees and other flowering plants that are native to this area. Well, one of the hurricanes washed out the bridges. However, thanks to the hard efforts of Gary, John and others, the bridges have been rebuilt. This time, the bridges are at a higher elevation, and should now withstand all the forces of nature..



Pictured here is one of the bridges spanning the creek. This new bridge was the final major feat needed to complete the trail. Once again it is passable. In previous years, Gary and John built the other bridge, but now the entire original trail is passable again. The trail starts behind the jam shack by the gazebo. It winds around and finally emerges behind Mr. Lewis' trailer.

Along the way, there are a number of trees that are identified with a marker. There is a guide to the trail in the Jam Shack. In this guide, it contains all the information that corresponds with the markers displayed at each location. Its really quite interesting.
